WEEK THREE: THE KINGDOM OF THE CHOSEN

God's people demand a king, and He grants their request... with mixed results

God's Kingdom: established by His friends Moses was trained in the wilderness for 40 years with Reuel "friend of God" He was entrusted with more authority than anyone in history because he learned how to be God's friend. ■The Law gave rules for future Kings. ■God knew Israel would reject His direct rule, again opting for an intermediary What is the divine purpose of Kings? ► All human governments find their source of authority in God himself. (Rom 13:1-7/ 1 Pet 2:13-14) God give human authority to ensure order and protect the defenseless. Kings are mediators between God and men. The righteous don't need external laws or kings to enforce them. Sinful men will replace God with kings. The Laws of Kings: (Deut. 17:14-20) Israel was the first nation to have laws limiting its king's rights! ■whom the LORD your God chooses from among your countrymen he shall not multiply horses, wives, silver and gold for himself he shall write for himself a copy of this law...and he shall read it all the days

of his life...that his heart may not be

lifted up above his countrymen

Do God's people need a king?

- ►In the beginning...leadership (and its blessings) came through families.
- ■Conquerors make "subjects" attempting to replace God's rule.
- ■God only establishes kings when we ask Him to. My Kingdom is not of this world...(John 18:36)
- Jesus left His Kingdom to shepherds and apostles. These are to equip the saints, not rule over them (Eph 4)

When God's people demand a king: The end of the Theocracy (15am 8)

- ■Israel, in the Promised land, was under "Judges" for c.400 years (1451 -1050 BC)
- ■The chief call of a "judge" is to remove evil from the land – beginning with the evil being tolerated by God's people.
- ■The chief call of the prophet is to call people into repentance, and back to God's rule over them

When God's people demand a king: The end of the Theocracy (1Sam 8) 5 appoint a king...like all the nations. ■To imitate other nations, who can only promote darkness, is to reject God's rule. 7 they have not rejected you, but...Me from being king over them The true motive: that our king may judge us and go out before us and fight our battles "We don't want the responsibility of managing our own freedom." What kings of the world are like: 8:10-18 he will take...take...take... Anyone willingly placed in the God's stead in set up for a fall. Human kings are easier to disobey and revolt against, but the Lord gives every nation the king it asks for. "Then you will cry out in that day because of your king whom you have chosen for yourselves, but the LORD will not answer you in that day." (1 Samuel 8:18) God's people get what they asked for King Saul – the consummate politician ► Lasted only 2 years in righteousness, 38 years as a rejected king! (1050-1010BC) ► Fell prey to political spirit – Seeks power and control by all means necessary. Persecutes God's friends! (David/priests) ■Driven by fear of man (since man established his rule, man can remove it) Beware the leaven of Herod

The War between the Kingdoms: David (a friend of God) – chosen for his heart. Hand picked from the line of Judah ("Praise" - the scepter will not depart...Gen 49:10) ► After Saul's death, his "house" made war with David for 7 years. (2 Sam ■There is an eternal struggle for the establishing of God's rule in the earth those who permit Him to rule are blessed THE KINGDOM OF DAVID (1010-970-The example of a man after God's Own Heart The Kingdom under David ► His 40 year reign (1010-970BC) is considered the Golden era of Israel. First act as king – regain Jerusalem for God's dwelling place ■ Next: Established the "Tabernacle of David" God made it the image of the New Covenant people! (Amos 9:11-12) David, like Moses – combined priest and King into one "office" ■ Most Psalms written during His reign The Kingdom under David David, like Moses – combined priest and King into one "office" Because He sought to glorify God as

- Because He sought to glorify God as the only true sovereign of Israel, He gained an eternal dynasty:
- ■2 Sam 7:16 ...your throne shall be established forever.
- Jesus most commonly called the "Son of David"

David saw the prophetic fulfillment of this eternal dynasty in the Spirit:

- Recognized the heavenly authority of his seed: (Psalm 110)
- prophesied the cross with detail (Ps 22)
- Every king which followed compared to him "he walked in the footsteps..."
- ■God spared Judah several times "because of my servant David..."

Solomon's reign (970-930BC)

- Regarded as a continuation of the Golden Age of Israel
- Completed the Temple project
- Expanded borders (largest they would ever become – even to this day)
- Renowned for wisdom (wrote most of the Proverbs, Psalms 72 and 127, The Song of Songs, and Ecclesiastes)
- Ended badly, set the stage for a divided Kingdom under a foolish son



The Kingdom Divided

Rehoboam (Solomon's son) harsh/immature in authority **Jereboam** (from tribe of Ephraim – first king of "Israel")

Northern Kingdom now called "Israel." (all tribes save Judah and Benjamin)

Southern Kingdom now referred to as "Judah" (Made up of Judah and Benjamin)



The Northern Kingdom (931-722 BC)

- ■Birthed in rebellion
- ► Had NO godly kings (save a short time under Jehu, who ended Jezebel)
- ► Made Samaria the capitol city
- Mainly served the local Caananite gods (Ashterah, Baal)
- ■Omri Ahab, Jezebel,
- Elijah and Elisha were prophets to Israel

"Israel" from Jereboam's reign until the death of Elisha (931-814BC)

Israel into Assyrian captivity - 722 BC				

Before the end...3 Prophets call out to Israel, and beyond

- Jonah, Amos & Hosea prophecy mainly to Israel
- Joel, Isaiah and Micah prophecy mainly to Judah
- ■All warn of a coming captivity, with promises of a restoration ahead.
- All point to a day beyond natural Israel's time –Kingdom of God through messiah

Before the end...God sends prophets...

<u>Jonah</u> – **825BC** (while Jeroboam II ruled Israel, and Uzziah ruled Judah)

- ■Sent to Ninevah, capitol of Assyria.
- A successful mission, carrying the clear favor of God!
- Revealed Israel's unwillingness to be God's light to the nations.
- Their destruction came from the nation they rejected even though God showed mercy

Before the end...God sends prophets...

Amos: (784)

- Judgment coming, but hope for a restoration ahead...
- Speaks to all the neighboring countries
 warning of God's judgment on them,
 too!
- <u>Amos 9:11-15</u> the New Covenant community!

Before the end...God sends prophets...


Hosea: (785-725)

- A living parable heartbreaking expression of God's pain over Israel
- ■Israel called His bride extended invitation to the gentiles: (2:19-23)
- Messianic prophecy: When Israel was a youth I loved him, And out of Egypt I called My son. (11:1)

Israel falls to the Assyrians (721BC)

2 Kings 17 – King Sargon of Assyria

- ■Took Samaria captive
- Resettled the land with Babylonians
- Allowed some priests to return



Judah – mixture of good and evil kings

- Kings who brought reformation, and ended their reign well: Asa, Jehoshaphat, Hezekiah, Josiah
- ■Their praise: did good and right in the sight of the LORD
- 1. removed the altars and high places
- 2. Repaired the temple
- 3. Identification repentance
- Yet, each one failed to completely cleanse Israel

Joel – first prophet to Judah...(800BC)

- Sent by God during Joash's reign
- Joash began well, restoring the temple, but engaged in treachery and political scheming.
- Joel an invasion is coming -- weep between the porch and the altar
- ■They did, and the ultimate fulfillment was delayed 2 centuries
- ■Glorious promises of the last days! (2:28-29) fulfilled in the upper room!

Isaiah sees the Kingdom in its glory

- Prophesied during Kings Uzziah, Jotham, Ahaz, and Hezekiah (62 years)
- A compilation of his oracles intense judgments for Israel...
- and judgments to all surrounding nations who touch God's chosen
- ■The most detailed messionic prophecies of any OT book!
- ■Spoke to God's Israel's eternal purpose through messiah...into eternity

Israel's bigger purpose in the earth:

2:2 The mountain of the house of the LORD Will be established as the chief of the mountains...all the nations will stream to it.

42:1...4 "Behold, My Servant, whom I uphold...He will bring forth justice to the nations...He will not be disheartened or crushed Until He has established justice in the earth

Israel's bigger purpose in the earth: 56:6-7 "Also the foreigners who join themselves to the LORD, ... Even those I will bring to My holy mountain And make them joyful in My house of prayer...For My house will be called a house of prayer for all the peoples." 60:1-3 "Arise, shine; for your light has come, And the glory of the LORD has risen upon you...Nations will come to your light, And kings to the brightness of your rising. Israel's bigger purpose in the earth: 62:1-2 For Zion's sake I will not keep silent, And for Jerusalem's sake I will not keep quiet, Until her righteousness goes forth like brightness, ...The nations will see your righteousness, And all kings your glory... 65:17 "For behold, I create new heavens and a new earth: And the former things will not be remembered or come to mind. The Messiah in Isaiah: 4:2 In that day the Branch of the LORD will be beautiful and glorious...11:1 Then a shoot will spring from the stem of Jesse, And a branch from his roots will bear fruit. 7:14 ...Behold, a virgin will be with child and bear a son, and she will call His name Immanuel. 9:6 For **a child** will be born to us, **a son** will be given to us; And the government will rest on His shoulders:

The Messiah in Isaiah: 53:12 Therefore, I will allot Him a portion with the great, And He will divide the booty with the strong; Because He poured out Himself to death, And was numbered with the transgressors; Yet He Himself bore the sin of many, And interceded for the transgressors. 61:1 The Spirit of the Lord GOD is upon me. Because the LORD has anointed me To bring good news to the afflicted The captors will become a blessing... 45:1...4 Thus says the LORD to Cyrus His anointed... "For the sake of Jacob My servant, And Israel My chosen one, I have also called you by your name; I have given you a title of honor Though you have not known Me. ■Cyrus, king of Persia would not be born for another century! ■Gave decree for the Jews to return from captivity, fully funded the Temple restoration project! Micah (Jotham → Hezekiah, 48 years) Reminded Israel of their divine purpose (like Isaiah) the mountain of the house of the LORD Will be established as the chief of the mountains Messigh to be born in Bethlehem: (5:2) But as for you, Bethlehem...From you One will go forth for Me to be ruler in Israel...

The church in Micah: Prophesied the "diaspora:" Micah 5:7 Then the remnant of Jacob Will be among many peoples Like dew from the LORD... The Jews who came for Pentecost returned to their "homeland" (Acts 11) - preaching Christ with their knowledge of His-story among His people The church in Micah: 4:6-7 In that day," declares the LORD, "I will assemble the lame And gather the outcasts..." I will make the lame a remnant And the outcasts a strong nation, Sound familiar? 1 Cor 1:26-7...there were not many wise according to the flesh, not many mighty, not many noble; but God has chosen the foolish things of the world to shame the wise, and God has chosen the weak things of the world to shame the things which are strong... Hezekiah's reign: Started well and ended well ■Temple reforms, idolatry removed, etc. ■ Was king during the invasion of Israel. Sennacharib invaded Judah (2 Kings 19-20, 2 Chr 32) - Hezekiah gave him tribute, full of fear. ► His prayer: 2 Kings 19:14-19 ■God delivers Kingdoms who acknowledge His dominion!
