3. All of the living will be "caught up"

<u>1 Thes 4:17</u> Then we who are alive and remain will be <u>caught up</u> together with them in the [clouds] to meet the Lord <u>in the air</u>...

► Air = the atmosphere around the earth

<u>NOTE</u>: "Clouds" in the scriptures by default refer to supernatural manifestations of God:

Matt 17:5 While he was still speaking, a bright <u>cloud</u> overshadowed them, and behold, a voice out of the cloud said...

Some notes about the "rapture:"

- "Rapture" does not appear in the bible.
- ■"Caught up" [harpazo] is the biblical term
- ► Futurist View (Left Behind):
 - Jesus comes in secret to take away His bride
 - → 7 year wedding supper in Heaven while tribulation (Rev 4-18) occurs back on earth
 - Jesus return with saints for millennial rule
 - **■**(popularized by Scofield reference bible)

Some notes about the "rapture:"

■We are "caught up" to meet the Lord in the air <u>on the Last Day</u> – simultaneous with the resurrection of the dead!

John 6:44 No one can come to Me unless the Father who sent Me draws him; and I will raise him up at the last day.

■There are NO scriptures which *directly* teach that saints will be *caught up / taken away* into heaven for any period of time!

4. All will stand before God's judgment sea

John 5:28-29...those who did the good deeds to a resurrection of life, those who committed the evil deeds to a resurrection of judgment.

Rev 20:12-13...and books were opened; and another book was opened, which is the book of life; and the dead were judged from the things which were written in the books, according to their deeds...and they were judged, every one of them according to their deeds.

5. All evil (and its fruit) is destroyed:

Revelation 20:14-15 ...death and Hades were thrown into the lake of fire. This is the second death...if anyone's name was not found written in the book of life, he was thrown into the lake of fire.

Matthew 25:41 ...'Depart from Me, accursed ones, into the eternal fire which has been prepared for the devil and his angels...

1Cor 15:24-26 then comes the end...He must reign until He has put all His enemies under His feet. The last enemy that will be abolished

is death.

6. The saints receive their rewards:

Rev 22:12 "And behold, I am coming quickly, and My reward is with Me...

Matt 16:27 the Son of Man will come...and then <u>He will reward each</u> according to his works.

<u>Luke 14:12-14</u> when you give a feast, invite the poor... <u>you shall be</u> repaid at the resurrection of the just.

<u>1 Cor 3:8</u> ...and each one will receive <u>his own reward according to his own labor</u>.

6. The saints receive their rewards:

- ■Based on all the "treasures laid up in heaven" (things done in/ with Christ)
- 1 Cor 3:12-15 Now if any man builds on the foundation with gold.

silver, precious stones, wood, hay, straw...If any man's work which he has built on it remains, he will receive a reward. If any man's work is burned up, he will suffer loss; but he himself will be saved, yet so as through fire.

► Like the parable of the talents/ minas

7. The saints receive glorified bodies:

■Permanent, physical bodies (which make *manifest* the life which has been on the inside since we were born again)

<u>Phil 3:20-21</u> ...we also eagerly wait for the Savior...who will transform our lowly body that it may be conformed to His glorious body...

<u>1 Cor 15:50-54</u> We shall not all sleep, but <u>we shall all be changed</u>; in a moment, in the twinkling of an eye, at the last trumpet...and <u>the</u> dead will be raised incorruptible

8. Life in the New (re-newed) earth begins:

■ An earth which has been being renewed by Christ through His Church now becomes Paradise – since evil has been removed 2 Pet 3:13 according to His promise we are looking for new heavens and a new earth, in which righteousness dwells.

<u>Note</u>: this is also a progressive work – Isaiah prophesied this about the church age:

Isaiah 65:17-25 For behold, I create new heavens and a new earth...

A few things which do not appear in any clear revelation of the scriptures:

- 1. A rising world order/ empire, which subdues the Kingdom of God, ruled by a satanically empowered antichrist.
- 2. A removal of all living saints from the earth before the Lord's return (leaving the world without a witness?!?)
- 3. A time of tribulation for the whole world, ending with the final & eternal punishment of those who live through it.

The already, but not yet, Kingdom

■The Kingdom in the earth is a progressive work, which has been entrusted to the Church:

Eph 1:22 And He put all things in subjection under His feet, and gave Him as head over all things to the church...

- ■Our commission is to make disciples of all nations, *bringing* the Kingdom
- → Apostles: "sent ones" sent to enculturate conquered nations to Roman ways

The already, but not yet, Kingdom

<u>Heb 9:28</u> so Christ also, having been offered once to bear the sins of many, will <u>appear</u> a second time <u>for salvation without reference to sin</u>, to those who eagerly await Him.

- ■The completion of the work of salvation comes at the end of the last age, when the <u>apostolic mission</u> has been successful.
- Jesus returns when the culture of the nations closely resembles the culture of heaven

What is Jesus waiting for?

■ The bible gives several indicators of when Jesus will return (hint: none of them gives a code for figuring out a specific date!)

The Church will mature and be a bride ready for her bridegroom:

Eph 4:13 ...until we all attain to the unity of the faith, and of the knowledge of the Son of God, to a mature man, to the measure of the stature which belongs to the fullness of Christ.

What is Jesus waiting for?

Ephesians 5:27...that He might present to Himself the church in all her glory, having no spot or wrinkle or any such thing; but that she

would be holy and blameless.

Rev 19:7...the marriage of the Lamb has come and <u>His bride has made herself ready</u>.

■i.e. -- When we finish getting ready for Him, the wedding's on!

What is Jesus waiting for?

The full harvest of the ages to come in:

<u>2Pe 3:9</u> [He] is patient toward you, not wishing for any to perish but for all to come to repentance.

- Explosive church growth: Worldwide: 600million in 1910; 2.3 billion in 2011
- On the day of Pentecost 3000 were saved. Today, it's <u>3000 per</u> hour!
- More Islamic converts to Christianity in the last decade than in all history combined!

These are the REAL "signs of the times:"

What is Jesus waiting for?

The enemies of The Kingdom of Light (NOT PEOPLE, -- demons) to be under the dominion of Jesus:

Heb 10:12-13 He [is] waiting from that time onward until his enemies be made a footstool for his feet.

Maybe the issue of eschatology is not *us waiting for the Lord*, but *Him waiting for us!*

Matt 16:18... I will build my church, and the gates of Hades shall not prevail against it...

22 Jesus prophesies the Last Days

Matthew 24 and Luke 21 contain the prophecy of Jesus of the "end of the age," and is the most often misinterpreted passage in the NT

Jesus prophesies His "coming" and the "end of the age"

► As a response to the disciples' question:

Matt 24:3 Tell us, when will these things happen, and what will be the sign of Your coming, and of the end of the age?

	■ Jesus' reply gives specific "signs," instructions, and even a timeframe, meant to be <u>understood</u> by those who believed – <u>like the parables</u> .

25	The time frame, and the historic event 34 "Truly I say to you, this generation will not pass away until all these things take place. ■ This prophecy must be about events which would happen within 40 years. (a biblical generation) 30AD – prophecy → 70AD Temple destroyed ■ Every detail Jesus prophesied happened during the next 40 years!
25	The time frame, and the historic event
	■ Jesus' <i>coming</i> is not the same as his <i>return</i> .
	► Matt 10:23truly I say to you, you will not finish going through the cities of Israel until the Son of Man comes.
	■NT writings of Jesus' "coming" all indicate "soon." We need not change the meaning of that word to see His word fulfilled!
	Rev 1:1things which must soon take place.
	Rev 22:7 "And behold, I am coming <u>quickly</u>

	What does Jesus' Coming refer to? <u>Matt 16:28</u> "Truly I say to you, there are <u>some of those who are</u>
	standing here who will not taste death until they see the Son of Man coming in His kingdom."
	Rev 1:7 BEHOLD, HE IS COMING WITH THE CLOUDS, and every eye will see Him, even those who pierced Him; and all the tribes of
	the earth will mourn over Him.
	■It must refer to an event happening during the lifespan of the hearer!

- **Ch.** 24 follows three chapters prophesying judgment upon Jerusalem, its leaders, and all those who associate with them.
- Curses fig tree → Parable of tenants → Parable of Wedding Feast → "seven woes"
- ► Harrowing judgment: 23:32-36

Truly I say to you, all these things will come upon this generation...

When are the "Last Days" → "end of the age"

►All of the apostles believed/ wrote that they were living in the Last Days/ end of the age

Now these things...were written for <u>our</u> instruction, upon whom the ends of the ages have come. (1 Corinthians 10:11)

Children, it is the last hour; and just as you heard that antichrist is coming, even now many antichrists <u>have</u> appeared; from this we know that <u>it</u> is the <u>last hour</u>. (1 John 2:18)

Q: The last hour of what?

When(what) WAS the end of the age?"

■ The last hour of the Old Covenant system, which ended fully when the Temple was destroyed in 70AD:

Heb 9:26 ...but now once at the consum-mation of the ages He has been manifested to <u>put away sin</u> by the sacrifice of Himself.

- ■The cataclysmic shift of the NT period was the change from Old to New Covenant.
- Jews were given one generation to enter

The end of an age → the beginning of a new

►After the Old Covenant was replaced, a permanent one was established:

<u>Heb 8:13</u> When He said, "A new covenant," He has made the first obsolete. But whatever is becoming obsolete and growing old <u>is ready to disappear</u>.

Speaking of the Temple – the centerpiece of the Old Covenant system.

	Not speaking of the end of the world. (as it is sometimes translated)

■Were in the time of John and the apostles: of which you have heard that it is coming, and now it is already in the world.

They do not believe Jesus is the Son of God (in the way we understand it)

The one who denies that Jesus is the Christ? This is the antichrist...

■Denied that Jesus was in a human body:

those who do not acknowledge Jesus Christ as coming in the flesh. his is the deceiver and the antichrist.

So, who is the antichrist?

- ► Antichrist: Ante-Christos a replacement/ substitute Christ/ means of salvation
- ► False teachers, leading God's people astray into a pagan, unbiblical philosophy:
- Gnosticism: Flesh is evil, so Christ must have been a "phantom" but not a real man.
- ■Gospel of Judas/ Thomas were written based on this worldview.
- ■No clear biblical connection to any of the characters in Revelation.
