



Venting our vengeful thoughts to God provides an avenue to reset our hearts back to a faithful, loving position before we do something rash.






Carrying the heart of the Good Shepherd means caring for His people even when we are at risk. Only Lirelings flee when the wolves are afoot.










Betrayal Lappens when trust is broken, which means there was an expectation of the betrayer, spoken or unspoken.


When we are betrayed, we have a choice to lay down our expectations and extend mercy, or to harden our hearts and Lope for punishment.




















Whenever we are betrayed, especially by those for whom we have sacrificed and served ... we are in good company
