



Part 20: Seeking HIS Kingdom, not ours.

2 Samuel 2:1-4




























I Then all the tribes of Israel came to David at Hebron and said, "Behold, we are your bone and your flesh.

David received three anointings as the Lord promoted Him into his authority. We each must receive a fresh anointing for each new assignment from the Lord.

Anointing is God's authorization and empowerment to carry out a Kingdom responsibility. Without it, we are merely accomplishing what could be done without God's help, and may even be helping build Babel.

Babel is a place built by men's hands where God is neither welcome nor needed. It is a place where we live disconnected from God, ultimately welcoming and strengthening the Kingdom of Darkness.

Hebron ("association"): - Where Abraham' made his Covenant - Judah's City of Refuge - Caleb's city

Hebron is the place where the kingdom(s) of the earth welcome and make covenant with the Kingdom of God.

32 "He will be great and will be called the Son of the Most High; and the Lord God will give Him the throne of His father David;



The first and most important question we should ask about any of our endeavors is: Whose kingdom am 1 establishing?


Is HIS Kingdom First? 1. Sundays only? 2. Prayer before meals? 3. Morning devotions? 4. Consistent / persistent

5. God is my co-pilot (and sometimes we switch seats) 6. His Kingdom is my vision. 7. Apart from Him I do nothing.




When God's Kingdom is being established, the Lardest resistance most always comes from the Old Order.


So it was for David, so it was for Jesus, so it will be for those who seek HIS Kingdom above all else.





