

1 Now I say, as long as the heir is a child, he does not differ at all from a slave although he is owner of everything,

Galatians 4:1-5

2 but he is under guardians and managers until the date set by the father.

3 So also we, while we were children, were held in bondage under the elemental things of the world.

4 But when the fullness of the time came, God sent forth His Son, born of a woman, born under the Law,

5 so that He might redeem those who were under the Law, that we might receive the adoption as sons.

We are no longer Under the Law, but the law (scriptural commands and principles) provides a structure to grow on until Christ is formed in us and we are fully led by the

Rules and principles are like training wheels to teach us God's ways, which are higher than ours, and are unattainable without the Grace of God.

"Tithing" was never intended to be a verb/ command, but rather a tangible expression of love from the heart of one who had been awakened to the reality of the goodness of God. Learning to give our first "tenth" to the Lord is like learning the arithmetic of Leavenly generosity.

9 Honor the LORD <u>from your</u> <u>wealth</u> And from <u>the first of all</u> <u>your produce</u>;

Proverbs 3:9-10

10 So your barns will be filled with plenty And your vats will overflow with new wine.

18 And Melchizedek king of Salem brought out bread and wine; now he was a priest of God Most High.

Genesis 14:18-23

19 He blessed him and said, "Blessed be Abram of God Most High, Possessor of heaven and earth; 20 And blessed be God Most High, Who has delivered your enemies into your hand." He gave him a tenth of all.

21 The king of Sodom said to Abram, "Give the people to me and take the goods for yourself."

22 Abram said to the king of Sodom, "I have sworn to ["exalted"] the LORD God Most High, possessor of heaven and earth,

23 that I will not take a thread or a sandal thong or anything that is yours, for fear you would say, 'I have made Abram rich.'

Abraham's tithe was born from a freewill, self-initiated response to God's favor, putting his treasure where His Leart was.

Abraham's revelation was that God possessed everything, and was giving Him an immeasurable inheritance. A tenth was the least He could do in response!

20 Then Jacob made a vow, saying, "If God will be with me and will keep me on this journey that I take, and will give me food to eat and garments to wear,

Genesis 28:20-22

22 "This stone, which I have set up as a pillar, will be God's house, and of all that You give me I will surely give a tenth to You."

Transactional giving is for those who have not yet encountered or embraced the Grace of God, and so have not entered into His gracious lifestyle.

When giving is done because of Law, the joy of giving is lost on us, and we do it only because we believe we have to.

The Law of Moses was a covenant based on a King-vassal model ("Suzerain" covenant). Israel was bound to God through a system framed by rewards and punishments.

Giving the tenth under Moses was a legal requirement to remain in covenant with God, and so the people came to view it like we view paying taxes.

Since it was Holy to the Lord, withholding the tithe was considered robbery in their covenant economy.

In the New Covenant mindset it all belongs to Him, and as His Leirs, it all belongs to us!

26 "Moreover, you shall speak to the Levites and say to them, 'When you take from the sons of Israel the tithe which I have given you from them for your inheritance...

Numbers 18:26

When we remain under the Law (giving because we have to), withholding our giving is like failing to pay our taxes.

What happens when we fail to pay our taxes?

8 "Will a man rob God? Yet you are robbing Me! But you say, 'How have we robbed You?' In tithes and offerings.

Malachi 3:8-11

9 "You are cursed with a curse, for you are robbing Me, the whole nation of you!

11 "Then I will rebuke the devourer for you, so that it will not destroy the fruits of the ground; nor will your vine in the field cast its grapes," says the LORD of hosts.

We are no longer under the covenant of Moses. We no longer have to pay tithes to the priesthood. He does not punish us for withholding our heart by withholding our tithes...

But when we lay up our treasures in heaven, the devourer has no access to steal our money.

The Grace of giving is based on a love relationship with a Father who owns all things and has given all things to us for an inheritance.

6 "You have sown much, but harvest little; you eat, but there is not enough to be satisfied; you drink, but there is not enough to become drunk;

Haggai 1:6-9

you put on clothing, but no one is warm enough; and he who earns, earns wages to put into a purse with holes."

7 Thus says the LORD of hosts, "Consider your ways!

8 "Go up to the mountains, bring wood and rebuild the temple, that I may be pleased with it and be glorified," says the LORD.

9 "You look for much, but behold, it comes to little; when you bring it home, I blow it away. Why?" declares the LORD of hosts,

"Because of My house which lies desolate, while each of you runs to his own house.

Sowing into the work of the Church is laying up treasures in heaven.

The New Covenant economy is based on sowing and reaping — not law. Its ways and rules are as inviolable as farming.

When we enter into Grace, we are now only subject to the innutable laws of sowing and reaping.

8 And God is able to make all grace abound to you, so that always having all sufficiency in everything, you may have an abundance for every good deed;

2 Corinthians 9:8-10

9 as it is written, "HE SCATTERED ABROAD, HE GAVE TO THE POOR, HIS RIGHTEOUSNESS ENDURES FOREVER."

10 Now He who supplies seed to the sower and bread for food will supply and multiply your seed for sowing and increase the harvest of your righteousness;

Like farming, the laws of sowing and reaping work relentlessly over the course of time.

Kingdom giving and financial stewardship is foreign to any get rich quick scheme.

The Maintenance Farmer Year One




- Owns 10 Acres
- Sows 50Kg of seed (enough to sow 2 acres)
- (Average seed potential is 10-fold)

The Maintenance Farmer Year One



- Reaps 500kg of rice
- Puts aside the best
 10% of his seed for sowing next year
 (50kg)
- He and family eat
 450 kg of rice that year.

The Maintenance Farmer Year Two



- Still Owns 10 Acres
 of potential for future
 sowing and reaping.
- Sows the 50Kg of prime seed he put aside, (same as last year)

The Maintenance Farmer Year Two




- Reaps 500kg of rice
- Again, puts aside
 the best 10% of his
 seed for sowing next
 year (50kg)
- He and family eat
 450 kg of rice that year. (Same as last year)

The Maintenance Farmer Years Three - Ten



- Still Owns 10 Acres of land (potential) 8 of which has gone fallow.
- Sows 50Kg of seed
 each year (always the
 best of last year's
 harvest), only uses 2
 acres (20%) of his
 potential.

The Poverty Farmer Year One



- Owns 10 Acres, (same potential as maintenance Sower)
- Sows 50Kg of seed (enough to sow 2 acres)
- His seed is just as good as the others'.

The Poverty Farmer Year One



- Reaps 500kgs of rice
- He and family eat
 475kg of rice that
 year (MUCH more then the Joneses).
- Has only 25kg (5%)
 left for sowing into
 next year's harvest.

The Poverty Farmer Year Two



- Still Owns 10 Acres of potential.
- Sows the leftover
 25Kg of seed he did not eat last year.
 (only enough to sow
 1 acre 10% of his potential)

The Poverty Farmer Year Two




- Reaps 250kg. (1/2 as much as last year)
- His family is mad at him because they are hungry.
 - Has to sell 4 acres to buy seed for next year and maintain his extravagant lifestyle.

The Poverty Farmer Year Three - Ten



- Has to keep selling off acreage to buy rice to feed his family, and new seed for sowing.
- His sowing and reaping potential decreases, and he ends up in a debt spiral.

The Prosperity Farmer Year One



- Owns 10 Acres
 (same as the other farmers)
- Sows 50Kg of seed (enough to sow 2 acres – same as the others)

The Prosperity Farmer Year One



- · Reaps 500kg of rice
- Puts aside the best 20% of his seed for sowing.
- His family pays a short-term price, living on 400kg of rice, sacrificing for the sake of sowing more generously.

The Prosperity Farmer Year Two



- Still owns 10 Acres of potential sowing and reaping.
- Now has 100Kg of prime seed to sow, held over from last year's sacrificial decisions.
- Can now sow 4 acres


 double last year

The Prosperity Farmer Year Two



- · Reaps 1000kg.
- · His family can eat up to 800kg of rice, and live well, but choose to live on 500 (still more than the other farmers' current provision) and have 500kg left to sow.

The Prosperity Farmer Year Three



- Still Owns 10 Acres, but now has enough seed to sow his full potential.
- Sows 500Kgs of prime seed.
 (enough for all 10 acres)

The Prosperity Farmer Year Four and beyond...



- Reaps 5000kgs of rice (in year 4 alone).
- Has more than enough to feed his family well.
- Is now selling seed to his neighbors.
- Is buying land to sow even more.

The Maintenance Farmer

by year 10



- Still living on 500kg of rice to feed his family (more than enough)
- Reaps millions of kg
 of rice and can feed
 the poor generously.
- Can sow nearly 9M acres.
- Has more than he knows what to do with.
