Part 3 We can only reap what we sow.

35 "In everything I showed you that by working hard in this manner you must help the weak and remember the words of the Lord Jesus, that He Himself said, 'It is more blessed to give than to receive."

Acts 20:35

Legalism's question is, "What do I HAVE to

GRACE's question is, what do 1 GET to do?"

6 Now this I say, he who sows sparingly will also reap sparingly, and he who sows bountifully will also reap bountifully.

2 Corinthians 9:6-14

7 Each one must do just as he has purposed in his heart, not grudgingly or under compulsion, for God loves a cheerful giver.

8 And God is able to make <u>all</u> grace abound to you, so that always having all sufficiency in everything, you may have an abundance for every good deed;

9 as it is written, "HE SCATTERED ABROAD, HE GAVE TO THE POOR, HIS RIGHTEOUSNESS ENDURES FOREVER."

10 Now He who supplies seed to the sower and bread for food will supply and multiply your seed for sowing and increase the harvest of your righteousness;

11 you will be enriched in everything for all liberality, which through us is producing thanksgiving to God.

12 For the ministry of this service is not only fully supplying the needs of the saints, but is also overflowing through many thanksgivings to God.

The world has "laws" of economics, based on observations of the behaviors of greed. ("Supply / Demand")

The Kingdom also has laws of economics, based on the behaviors of generosity. (Sowing and reaping)

38 "Give, and it will be given to you. They will pour into your lap a good measure-pressed down, shaken together, and running over.

Luke 6:38

For by your standard of measure it will be measured to you in return.

The economy of the kingdom works on the Same principles as agricultural sowing and reaping.

When we have seed, we can eat it (use it for ourselves) or sow it (into various Kingdom growing "fields")

Places to Sow for 1. those who cannot (or will not) repay you 12 And He also went on to say to the one who had invited Him, "When you give a luncheon or a dinner,

Luke 14:12-14

do not invite your friends or your brothers or your relatives or rich neighbors, otherwise they may also invite you in return and that will be your repayment.

13 "But when you give a reception, invite the poor, the crippled, the lame, the blind,

14 and you will be blessed, since they do not have the means to repay you; for you will be repaid at the resurrection of the righteous."
