It is not the critic who counts: not the man who points out how the strong man stumbles or where the doer of deeds could have done better. The credit belongs to the man who is actually in the arena,

whose face is marred by dust and sweat and blood, who strives valiantly, who errs and comes up short again and again, because there is no effort without error or shortcoming,

but who knows the great enthusiasms, the great devotions, who spends himself in a worthy cause; who, at the best, knows, in the end, the triumph of high achievement,

and who, at the worst, if he fails, at least he fails while daring greatly, so that his place shall never be with those cold and timid souls who knew neither victory nor defeat.

Stepping in to the arena means repenting of sitting on the sidelines criticizing, and putting your shoulder into something meaningful.

"Meaningful" does not mean "Listory making," but rather impact on the lives of others.

10 For we are His workmanship, created in Christ Jesus for good works, which God prepared beforehand so that we would walk in them.

Ephesians 2:10

What would you do with your life if you knew you could not fail 4 14?

Fear of failure is overcome by trusting the voice of the One who called us over the voice of the critic.

The enemy's favorite ploy is to keep us away from the fight in the first place by turning our faith into fear.

11 'Truly I say to you, among those born of women there has not arisen anyone greater than John the Baptist! Yet the one who is least in the kingdom of heaven is greater than he.

Matthew 11:11-12

12 "From the days of John the Baptist until now <u>the kingdom of heaven</u> <u>suffers violence</u>, and <u>violent men take</u> <u>it by force</u>.

Wherever Jesus becomes manifest in new territory, there is always a storm of some sort.

Name someone who advanced the Kingdom of Heaven in the earth without opposition.

If you are facing opposition while pursuing the will of God, CONGRATULATIONS! You are on the right track.

Resolve never to be a harsh critic of those who have stepped out to accomplish something sreat for the Kinsdom.

Determine that the voice of the critic (especially the one within) will never be louder than the Voice of the One who called you.

Consider Low you might encourage others in heir own arena, and only determine only to offer criticism designed to encourage them.

Seek His Face about what arena belongs to you, and step into it boldly and without apology.
