Don't be a Jonah

1 But it greatly displeased Jonah and he became angry.

Jonah 4:1-3

2 He prayed to the LORD and said, "Please LORD, was not this what I said while I was still in my own country? Therefore in order to forestall this I fled to Tarshish, for I knew that You are a gracious and compassionate God, slow to anger and abundant in lovingkindness, and one who relents concerning calamity.

When we use the word justice, we usually mean vengeance.

God is just, and no one escapes His judgment. But through Christ mercy triumphs over judgment, and anyone can be justified through Christ.

To release someone who has done us harm from our God-like desire for justice requires faith like a mustard seed.

3 "Be on your guard! If your brother sins, rebuke him; and if he repents, forgive him.

4 "And if he sins against you seven times a day, and returns to you seven times, saying, "I repent," forgive him."

5 The apostles said to the Lord, "Increase our faith!"

6 And the Lord said, "If you had faith like a mustard seed, you would say to this mulberry tree, 'Be uprooted and be planted in the sea'; and it would obey you.

Forgiveness begins with an act of the will a choice to forgive,

but also a choice to engage our faith, which opens us to receive grace to forgive from the heart.

The fruit of forgiving from the heart is compassion for the one who wronged us.
